

What is the difference between a spectator and a player? The answer is that there is a difference between the commitment. 
Don't be a fan of Christ, get in the game and be a follower. The sacrifice and cost is a game and life changer. See you at the Church!






Health kits delivered to UMCOR

The 205 health kits that our women assembled in November have now been delivered to UMCOR Sager-Brown in Baldwin, Louisiana.

The campus usually is bustling with activity, but for the past 2 years, due to Covid, it has been closed to everyone except by appointment only. When we arrived at our appointed time, we placed the boxes containing the health kits inside the big box on the loading dock at the Depot and then went to the administration office and delivered the envelope containing the



check to cover the cost of the toothpaste that will later be added to the kits.



Miss Betty Foulcard, who has worked on this campus since it was opened right after Hurricane Andrew in 1992, shared that this has been a very tough two years and she is looking forward to when they will be able to reopen the campus to volunteers.

There will be need for lots of volunteers to help get all of the donations ready to be sent out. During the past two years, requests continue to come in for health kits, cleaning buckets and school kits and they have been able to ship them out. There still are some items in the Depot ready to be shipped out, but the supply is dwindling.


